

Historic Landmark #33



Ferry Master's Cabin 721 Hill Blvd.

John Rylee was the river boat captain and used the cabin as the ferry master's office, which was originally located at the bank of the river (currently under Lake Granbury). There was another ferry crossing at Stockton Bend but it was not used as frequently as the one nearer town. The land along that section of the river belonged to Y.J. Rylee and was later divided. John Rylee was given the part which the ferry office was on.

This building has been relocated at least twice in its history. First, when the Brazos River was dammed to create Lake Granbury, and second during the construction of the Avalon on the Lake Apartment complex on Crawford Court. The original location was next to the river, which is currently inundated by Lake Granbury.
