Granbury News-Crockett-Crawford Building

The Granbury News-Crockett-Crawford Building was built in 1900. It is a remaining symbol of Granbury's early small, rural town newspaper publishing. The early Granbury newspaper brought local, state, and national news.

Some of the significant people associated with the Granbury News-Crockett-Crawford Building are: Frank Gaston, who was editor of the Granbury News from 1888-1930, Ashley Crockett, grandson of Davy Crockett, who wrote and edited for Granbury's newspapers for many years, and Norma Crawford publisher of the Hood County News-Tablet and director of the First National Bank. Mrs. Crawford led a drive to save the Hood County Courthouse Clock Tower through her newspaper in 1969. The building was moved to its current location in 2000.
