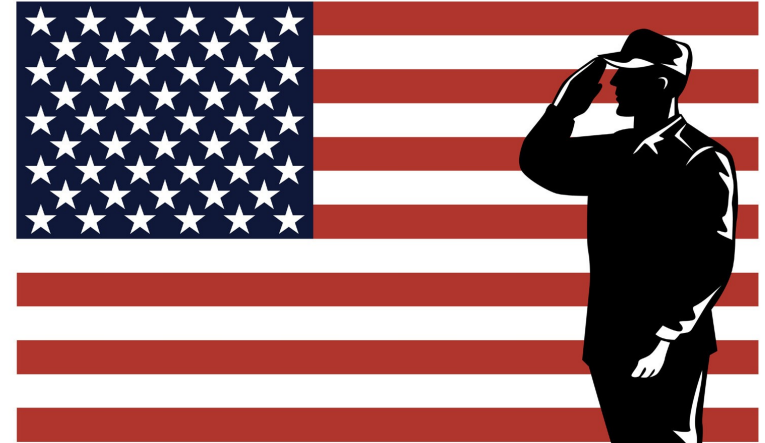

Robin Greer grew up in the Lipan area and is not just a Veteran but is also the daughter of two Veterans as both her mother, and her father served. She is also the wife of a Veteran, the mother of a Veteran, and has a daughter currently serving in the Air Force today.

Robin had been serving Veterans in a volunteer capacity for many years before, at the age of 36, she decided to join the Navy Reserves. Two weeks after she was sworn in, 911 happened and her life was forever changed. She initially joined as an Intelligence Specialist, but with the growing need for Security Forces, she cross rated over to the rate of Master At Arms and went on to spend the majority of her Reserve commitment on active orders.

Because she had degrees in Criminal Justice and Technical Writing, as well as a background in Law Enforcement, her civilian resume gained the attention of the Center for Security Forces in Little Creek, Virginia. She was soon mobilized in order to become part an 8 man team that worked to change the role of Master at Arms from Navy Law Enforcement, to Naval Security Forces. During this time, she gained the title of Master Training Specialist and worked diligently to build and reshape the Master at Arms community into an elite group who would now be responsible for the Anti-Terrorism/ Force Protection needs of the Navy.

After serving the majority of her 8 year Reserve Commitment on active duty, she chose not to re-enlist and returned to the civilian sector where she has made it her life's work to serve Veterans in need. Robin has been the Veteran Services Coordinator for Pecan Valley Center's since 2013 and covers the counties of Hood, Johnson, Erath, Somervell, Parker and Palo Pinto that have a combined Veteran population of over 38,000. She was actively involved with the Granbury Memorial Lane Project and continues to serve on the Friends of Memorial Lane Committee. Robin also active with and holds membership with American Legion Post 75, AmVets Post 133, VFW Post 7835 Auxiliary and is also member of the newly chartered Granbury DAV Post 238.
